



ARTICLES OF AMENDMENT OF OSCEOLA ROD & GUN CLUB, INC.

A. The present articles of incorporation indicate, in Article 3, that the purpose of the corporation is to:

Preserve game, game fish and song and insectivorous birds and to procure the enactment of desirable legislation insuring their better protection, to lend assistance in the proper enforcement of game laws and in general to promote a closer unity and fellowship among all true sportsmen, landowners and lovers of nature and to promote greatly safety in hunting and fishing.

B. Article 3 of the original Articles of Incorporation shall be amended by the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED, That purpose of the corporation shall be as follows:

- a. The organization is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and/or scientific purposes under section 501c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
- b. No part of the net earnings of the organization shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the organization shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in the purpose clause hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the organization shall be the carrying on or propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the organization shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of this document, the organization shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by an organization exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future tax code, or (b) by any organization, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future tax code.
- c. Upon the dissolution of the organization, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose.

- C. This Amendment is hereby adopted by the board of directors this 29 Th day of March, 2004 in accordance with sec. 181.1002, Wis. Stats.
